Administrative Update:

Principal Update: Our student population is currently at 445 kiddos. The Travel Lodge is now permanently closed.

Our kinder intake meeting was well attended, and we have 35 new registrations for JK next year. Off to a great start.

Winter Carnival (Feb 23) is coming up and we are looking for volunteers for a Hot chocolate station. Council will pass a motion of \$300 for payment of the hot chocolate. Motion was passed an approved.

Play Structure Update:

2016 was when WEG was notified that the kinder structure would be removed. Covid hit in 2020 and all fundraising (almost all) ceased. Officially, in 2023, the kinder structure was removed. We also learned that our senior structure was also decommissioned.

Currently, we have the plans that have been drafted by the school board. Plan A and Plan B are available, and they have been sent out via email. The costings that came back were a big surprise to all members of council. We currently have 110k that we raised via fundraising. As a council, we have countered the School board because of the costings and the fact that they must take into account equity and the fact that their financial contribution has not increased since 2016.

The Board has come forward with a commitment to help but we don't know what that looks like financially. They have told Us that they will put a structure in place, but we don't know what that looks like yet. Great News and a Huge financial Help:

We do have a donor who will give Us 50k and up to another 50k in matching efforts.

What are we doing to try and get more donations?

1: We are currently working with developers for donations

2: We've contacted the WEG law firm for a donation.

3: We are hoping to have donations driven to MiCharity from the community

4: We are also starting the grant application process so that we can have larger donations in lump sums.
